Deana: What has Obie taught you?

Ty: He's taught me to be careful and how I need to treat him. He gives me signs that I can understand and tells me how I treat him. Sometimes those signs mean that he's uncomfortable in certain ways and that's how I know I'm doing something wrong and that's when I try to make it better for him. Obie has taught me what it means to treat people the way you want to be treated. Some horses and some people have had bad things happen to them in their past and you don't want to bring those feelings back for them.
