On New Year's Eve I came across a resolution challenging me to ground myself in the joyful parts of life. It went like this: Stop and recognize happy moments when you're in the middle of them. Literally stop and say out loud, "This is a happy time!" Well, it is time to recognize some happy moments at Steadfast. At the recent dedication ceremony for Peace Pavilion we were joined by an abundantly joyful crowd of visitors. In addition to prayers of dedication, we celebrated the hundreds of volunteer hours given to the building of this beautiful facility. It is now very near completion.

A great highlight of Sunday's dedication ceremony was the words given by two of our Storytellers. These kids are previous apprentices who are now growing into a place of leadership and learning to tell their stories. They told their stories beautifully in front of our crowd of over 120 visitors. One of the kids explained this perfectly saying, "This is Jesus' story showing up in me." She went on to say, "I use to have anxiety but through what I have learned at Steadfast I don't have anxiety that much anymore. Look, I'm up here speaking to you!" The other Storyteller who spoke told of his struggles with self-hate, self-harm, and attempts at taking his own life. Then he said, "Steadfast saved my life because here I found some peace."

Indeed, these are strong words. They are words bearing proof of the power of Jesus. My heart overflows with gratitude for all that has transpired in providing this farm as a place for Jesus and his healing power to be made known.

Peace in the Chaos - Spring Sessions ~ Tod Bethea

In me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world. John 16:33

Have you ever found yourself saying when "blank" is over my life will get better? Whether it is school or a job, health or financial crisis, broken cars or hearts, many of us have said this. I have; 1744 times to be exact! We feel that once over this hump there will be smooth sailing. But the truth is, as noted in the verse above, life in a broken world is chaotic. In the last few years with our deeply divided world it has been hard to find peace. I keep waiting for the storm to calm but what I really need is calm in the storm, peace in the chaos. Volunteer Spotlight: Dave Schreiber

I had the opportunity to catch up with Dave Schreiber who has been our primary support and contact person with Habitat for Humanity. Here are the highlights from our conversation.

Deana: You're retired. You could do anything you want to do. Why do you spend so much time volunteering?

Dave: I've been very fortunate, in my career, in my life, and it's just time to give some of that back. I would just assume do something for someone else that do everything for me just because I have retired.

Deana: Much of what you do is through Habitat for Humanity? Why do you believe in Habitat?

Dave: Habitat for Humanity helps the disadvantaged. Through Habitat these families can afford a house. We can give them a hand-up but not a hand-out. A

lot of our families are single mothers with 2-3 children, some with disabilities. If we can give them a secure safe place to live at a reasonable cost then it's a benefit to the community and the family. We have a tremendous volunteer base at Habitat and we all come out of the same cloth, pretty much. We're all retired and all looking to give back and help the community.

Deana: You have been an amazing support to Steadfast. What have you observed that has made you want to be here and help?

Dave: When I first met you and Tod I knew that you had a plan and that you were passionate about helping people through the horse ministry. The more I talked with you the more I saw that you love what you do. So I decided to talk to the Habitat Board and we decided it would be a good thing to do. We would just come and help you folks!

As she spent some time in the beginning getting used to her new herd and learning the pecking order and where she would fall in ine, she ran across an unlikely friend- our donkey Jeffrey. Since Jeffrey joined us at the farm she has always been an underdog. She is old, a bit lame from years of hard living, and stays to herself. While she has never

had any issues within the herd, she also has never had any friends. But, when she and Willow met there was an instant friendship formed and the result has been beautiful to watch. Because of this friendship, Willow has found purpose. She is now the self-appointed protector of sweet Jeffrey. In turn. Jeffrey has experienced, perhaps for the first time in a very long time, her worthiness and value to the herd. They have provided each other with a joy that goes beyond words. We can look at this unusual friendship and are reminded of the importance of community in our own lives. Just like Jeffrey we all need to be reminded that our lives have value, and like Willow we must know that we were created to have a purpose. The Lord made us relational beings- we should be seeking Him every day so we can grow in a relationship with Him and with each other. We can look at this unlikely duo and not only see great purpose, but also God's grace, mercy, and the reminder that he loves and values us all.

Programming for Wellness and Recovery

Exciting new group programming will begin this
