Scientific studies have uncovered amazing correlations between acts of kindness and improved emotional and physical health. Here are a few of the benefits that can be reaped from a simple act of kindness:

- 1. Kindness brings connection which helps alleviate isolation and depression.
- 2. Kindness has shown to increase self-esteem, empathy and compassion.
- 3. Kindness can decrease anxiety and stress and improve mood and relationships.
- 4. Kindness boosts your immune system and can lower your blood pressure.
- 5. Kindness can help slow the aging process. Interestingly, Kindness works on both ends of the transaction with the same positive effects for both the giver and the receiver.

I hear story after story from our kids (and parents) at Steadfast about trouble with Bullies and Bullying. There are also numerous studies that have found correlations between the Bully issue and self-harm and suicide. At 3 am, the simple thought bombarded me, "The world just needs to be more kind!" Then I found this encouraging information:

- 1. Kindness is teachable!
- 2. We can develop habits of kindness just like we build any other type of habit such as exercise or healthy eating.
- 3. Developing habits of kindness can improve attitudes and behaviors and reduce emotional distress.\

From this 3 am encounter our Steadfast Summer Fall Curriculum on Kindness has been developed. In the near future, we will also be offering Kindness Encounters for visiting groups from the community. This is "kind" of exciting because Kindness is contagious. Truly, the world does just need to be more kind and we are praying for a whole new pandemic wave...the Kindness kind.


